

Michele Graziadei is full professor of Comparative Private Law at the University of Torino, Italy. After graduating *magna cum laude* in law at the University of Torino in 1984, he became researcher at the law Faculty of the University of Trento (1986 – 1995), and was promoted Associate Professor at the University of Insubria (Como) (1986 – 1995). He was appointed full Professor of Comparative Private Law at the Università del Piemonte Orientale (2000-2008). In that University he served as head of the Law Department for six years. Since 2008 he is at the University of Torino, where he was first called to the Chair of Private Law. At the University of Torino, Prof. Graziadei served as director of the PHD School for the Social Sciences (7 phd programs) and is currently Vice President of the Scuola di Studi Superiori. In the course of his career, Michele Graziadei was visiting Professor at many Universities (Cornell Law School, at Paris II, Panthéon Sorbonne, Université Lyon III, at the University of Luxembourg), and participated to several international research projects. As a consultant, he contributed to the drafting of San Marino's law on trusts. His first monograph *Agire nell'interesse altrui- Undiscolsed Agency e Trust* (Trento 1985) was reviewed by Bernard Rudden in the American Journal of Comparative Law and by David Ibbetson in the Cambridge Law Journal. He is the author of nearly a hundred publications, including *Commercial Trusts in European Private Law*, Cambridge U.P, 2005 (with L. Smith and U. Mattei); *The Development of fiducia in Italian and French Law from the 14th century to the End of the Ancien Régime*, in Helmholz and Zimmermann (eds), *Itinera Fiducia- Trust and Treuhand in Historical Perspective*, Berlino, 1998; *Recognition of common law trusts in civil law jurisdictions under the Hague Trusts Convention with particular regard to the Italian experience*, in L. Smith.(eds.), *Re-imagining the Trust Trusts in Civil Law*, Cambridge U.P., 2012; *Fiducia e trust in Italia*, in Studi Urbinati, 2015 ss. He is a titular member of the international academy of Comparative law, and the President of SIRD, Società Italiana per la Ricerca nel Diritto Comparato, Italy's National Committee of the International Academy.
